




Our exciting 'About Ripon' Community







Gingerbread Men Recipe



350g/12oz plain flour, plus extra for rolling out
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
2 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp ground cinnamon125g/4½oz butter
175g/6oz light soft brown sugar
1 free-range egg
4 tbsp golden syrup

- 1. Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon and pour into the bowl of a food processor. Add the butter and blend until the mix looks like breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar.
- 2. Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together, add to the food processor and pulse until the mixture clumps together. Tip the dough out, knead briefly until smooth, wrap in cling film and leave to chill in the fridge for 15 minutes.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Line two baking trays with greaseproof paper.
- 4. Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm/¼in thickness on a lightly floured surface. Using cutters, cut out the gingerbread men shapes and place on the baking tray, leaving a gap between them.
- 5. Bake for 12–15 minutes, or until lightly golden-brown. Leave on the tray for 10 minutes and then move to a wire rack to finish cooling. When cooled decorate with the writing icing and cake decorations, if using.

Linda's Recipe for Cheese Cake Bomb

1 large or 2 small jam Swiss roll(s)(Sliced for lining domed bowl)1 x packet Cheese Cake mixPlus ingredients that are listed on the cheesecake box.

1 x 1 litre domed bowl.

Clingfilm.

- 1. Line the bowl with the Clingfilm.
- 2. Slice the Swiss roll(s) and line the bottom and sides of the bowl.
- 3. Make the cheesecake mix, as per instructions, pour into the lined bowl, cool in fridge.
- 4. Make the biscuit base, as per instructions, and place on top of the cheesecake mixture. Pat it down gentle to compact it.
 - 5. Place in fridge to cool for the required time.
- 6. When ready to serve place a plate, larger in size than the top of the bowl. Turn upside down and carefully remove the bowl and Clingfilm.

 Your Cheesecake bomb is ready to serve.

Karen's Delicious Mincemeat Slices



8oz self raising flour
4oz hard magarine
4oz caster sugar
1 egg, beaten
Milk to mix
Jar of mincemeat
A little caster sugar to sprinkle on top



- 1. Grease an 8" x 6" shallow tin.
- 2. Rub the margarine into the flour to form crumbs. Stir in the sugar.
- 3. Gradually add the beaten egg and a little milk if needed to form a soft pastry mix.
- 4. Divide the pastry into two. Roll out half and line the base of the tin, firming down.
 - 5. Spread a thin layer of mincemeat over the pastry base.
- 6. Roll out the remaining half of the pastry and place on top of the mincemeat layer, firming gently. Brush with milk and sprinkle with caster sugar.
 - 7. Bake in a preheated oven, gas 5, 190C. for 15 minutes.


Beth and Jamie both think this would make a good activity for the summer workshops next year so everyone can take part.

If anyone would like to help by pressing leaves and flowers for us, then that would be great and we can use them next year. "




















